



What is it?

Definitions:

- TBT includes anything that we do that is not directly related to performing the job or typically covered in a permit/JSA process.
- Everything in between.



- Accidents involving TBT approximately 35-40%.
 - Examples:
 - Someone rolling their ankle when walking to the jobsite.
 - Tripping over a raised area when walking and falling.
 - Climbing a scaffold ladder to access job and slipping.
 - Bumping into process equip. while backing a vehicle

How do we handle these types of incidents?

Typically in a reactive way –

We asked ourselves the question..."What process do we have to identify potential hazards and mitigate before working?" JSA



The best way for us to address this was to include Task Between the Task in our JSA process and form.

Process to initiate and drive Task Between the Task

- Reformat the JSA and revise policy/procedure.
- Engage and train workforce.
 - Involved our crews in discussion around, "What is a Task Between the Task".
 - Gain feedback to discuss and share.
- Utilize various communications to engage all in TBT.
- Dry erase board poster placed in meeting areas so ideas around various tasks can be written and discussed in safety meetings.
- Verify process is working through JSA auditing/observations.
