## Fire Extinguisher: P.A.S.S

Welcome to our safety training on using a fire extinguisher. It is imperative to master the appropriate use of a fire extinguisher in emergency situations. The procedure is straightforward when guided by a crucial acronym: **P.A.S.S.**

### **P.A.S.S. stands for:**

- **PULL** the pin.
- **AIM** low, pointing the extinguisher nozzle (or its horn or hose) at the base of the fire.
- **SQUEEZE** the handle to release the extinguishing agent.
- **SWEEP** from side to side at the base of the fire until it appears to be out.

### **PULL the pin:**

This will break the tamper seal. Ensure that you stand several feet away from the fire, ensuring that you have an escape route in case the fire becomes unmanageable.

### **AIM low:**

It's crucial to target the source of the fire—the base. Aiming at the flames won't be as effective. Get as close as is safely possible and point the nozzle, horn, or hose at the base of the flames.

### **SQUEEZE the handle:**

By squeezing the handle, you release the extinguishing agent inside. In case the fire doesn't go out immediately, be prepared to let go to avoid overuse and ensure you have enough agent left if the fire reignites.

### **SWEEP from side to side:**

A sweeping motion is essential. Instead of focusing on a single point, you'll cover a wider area, increasing your chances of extinguishing the fire completely. Keep your focus on the fire's base.

### **Additional Safety Tips:**

1. **Always keep your back to a clear exit** when using the extinguisher, so you can make an easy escape if the fire grows, or the room becomes smoky.
2. **Inspect fire extinguishers monthly** to ensure they are in good condition and replace them if needed.

**In conclusion, safety should always be our top priority. With the P.A.S.S. technique, you are now equipped with the basic knowledge needed to use a fire extinguisher safely and effectively. Always remember, if the fire becomes too large or you feel unsafe, evacuate immediately and call for professional help.**
